

Energy Labelling

On 16 October 2012, Regulation EU 874/2012 of the European Commission on energy labelling of electric lamps and luminaires came into force.

The regulation sets out the requirements for the labelling of electric lamps and the provision of additional product information on electric lamps, e.g. for: LED lamps and LED modules, as well as the labelling requirements for luminaires designed for the operation of such lamps and marketed to end-users, even if incorporated into other products (e.g. furniture) which do not rely on the supply of energy for their primary purpose.

Electric lamps must bear an energy label from 1 September 2013. From 1 March 2014, luminaires must also bear the energy label if they are offered to end users at a point of sale. In this case, a label must be visibly affixed near the luminaire on display.

From January 2014, Liin will label luminaires with the corresponding energy label.

Liin will always provide the dealers with the necessary energy labels in good time for the labelling of the exhibits.
